Of Interest

New initiatives to deliver greater support for people entering hospitals and returning to the community

Mental Health Minister Roger Cook has announced two new initiatives to deliver better recovery opportunities for people experiencing mental health and alcohol and other drug issues. Both initiatives are a first for Western Australia in line with the McGowan Government's ongoing commitment to provide more wraparound care in hospitals and the community.

In the first initiative, Active Recovery Teams (ART) are being established in ten metropolitan and regional locations. The aim of this 18-month pilot model is to bridge the gap between clinical mental health services inside hospitals and the community-based organisations who provide care outside of hospitals.

The teams will initially be established in adult and youth services located at Armadale, Bentley, Midland, Murdoch, Osborne Park, Perth, Peel and Rockingham, as well as in the Midwest and Wheatbelt regions. The first services are anticipated to be operational by March 2021.

ASPIRE Program Update

ASPIRE stands for "Advancing Successful Peer Inclusion and Readiness for Employment" and aims to create new employment pathways into peer work roles in Western Australia through a partnership of Peer Support Workers and employers.

Over the last few months, the team have been busy developing Individual Vocational Activity training modules for Peer Support Workers; looking at topics such as job readiness; interpersonal skills and mind fitness. The content has been created through consultations with over 80 Peer Support Workers and Peer Support Champions across the State. It is now going through a review process before being piloted later this year.

Employers will be assisted with workplace readiness and inclusion through a readiness toolkit and access to skilled peer work student placements. If you are an employer of Peer Support Workers, we would love to hear from you as we develop the Workplace Readiness Program.

As a result of new and successful connections, the project aims to boost employable skills and employment outcomes for individuals and create new employment pathways with employers that are inclusive, confident and motivated to employ peer workers.
